## Considerations Prior to Puppy Ownership

*Please take the time to review this information before submitting your deposit.*

*Our receipt of deposit implies your understanding and agreement with these items:*

- Your new puppy will keep you very busy, especially during the first few weeks and months. The puppy will need to be let out of his/ her crate every 1-2 hours for bathroom breaks and supervised playtime. The puppy will need to be let out of his/her crate several times during the night for bathroom breaks. The number of times during the day and night that the puppy will need to be let out for bathroom breaks will decrease as the puppy ages.
- You will need to “puppy-proof” your home similar to the way you would baby-proof your home. Items you don’t want chewed (i.e. boots, cell phones, toys) should be put up and away. Trash cans, cleaning chemicals, and “people food” should be in secure cabinets. Do what you can to limit accessibility to electrical cords. Verify that your houseplants and landscape plants are not toxic to dogs – many are! Choose your new pups toys carefully that parts and “squeakers” cannot be torn off and eaten; all puppy play, especially with toys, should be supervised for at least the first few months.
- You will be taking your puppy home at approximately 7 weeks of age. A puppy of this age will be extremely high energy and will need lots of supervised playtime. As your puppy ages, he/she will continue to need lots of play and eventually exercise as Labs are high-energy dogs. Your dog is not considered an “adult’ dog until 2 years of age, and even then, will be high-energy.
- You should start working on basic obedience with your dog as soon as you take it home, especially stressing the word “no” when the pup does wrong. We recommend lots of praise when he/she does good, and lots of consternation when he/she does bad. We encourage electronic collar training no younger than 6 months of age. Your dog will also not be mature enough to begin gun dog training or any other formal training until it has reached six months of age, minimum. Keep in mind that even though basic training starts immediately, it can take years to create a dog that’s truly a well-oiled machine.
- Dogs communicate with their mouths and muzzles. If your pup is nipping or biting something he/she shouldn’t, communicate back the same way: pinch his/her mouth tightly shut and say “no!” It is up to you to discipline your dog of any/all bad habits and this takes time and energy. ALL puppies go through this stage!

- No refunds are given on deposits once received except if the color/gender pup you deposited on is not available at the time of your pick; in that situation, we can refund your deposit. If the color/gender pup you deposited on is not available at the time of your pick, but there are other color/gender pups available in the litter, you may choose one of those pups if you prefer.
- No refunds are given for pups purchased/taken home except for health issues as covered in our health guaranty and/or any other health issues the breeder may consider. We will not refund you your deposit or purchase price on a puppy for any other reason. Be sure that you have the time, energy, and other resources necessary to fit a puppy into your life before you purchase one!
